CEOS SAR Workshop 2023 at DLR

How to reach DLR

The DLR's Oberpfaffenhofen site is located approximately 25 kilometers west of Munich on the Munich-Lindau highway (A96). There are several ways to get to DLR.

Airport Access to City

DLR is easily accessible via Munich International Airport, which is located approximately 30 km northeast of Munich city center and offers many national and international connections.

All recommended conference hotels are located along the S-Bahn (suburban train) line S8, which also connects to the airport. There is no need to change trains on the S8 line. You can also take the S-Bahn line S1 (towards Ostbahnhof) from Munich Airport. In this case, please note that you will have to change trains at 'Laim' station and continue with the S-Bahn line S8 in the direction of Herrsching.

Please also note that not all trains on the S8 line continue to Herrsching and that some trains, especially in the evening, may end earlier.

Public Transport

From Munich city center, take the S-Bahn line S8 in the direction of Herrsching.

- By foot: Exit the train at 'Neugilching' or 'Wessling' station and walk to DLR (about 2.5 kilometers from both stations).
- Taxi: Available from S-Bahn station 'Unterpfaffenhofen-Germering' (12 km to DLR).
- Bus:
 - from S-Bahn station 'Wessling' – take bus 947 or X910,
 - from S-Bahn station 'Neugilching' – take bus 947 alight at 'DLR'.

By Foot

Leave the S-Bahn station "Neugilching" in the direction of "Landsberger Straße" and turn right. Stay on the right sidewalk until you reach a traffic light with a McDonald's and a gas station in sight.

Go straight through the traffic light and cross the bridge over the highway. After 200 meters, the sidewalk will take you through a pedestrian tunnel under the main road. There you have to cross a street with another traffic light. Follow the green fence of the DLR campus until you reach the main entrance gate.

By Taxi

A taxi ride from Munich airport to DLR will cost about 100 EUR (approx. 45 min) and from Munich city center about 65 EUR (approx. 40 min).

By Car

Take the highway A96 Munich-Lindau. Leave the highway at Exit 32, Oberpfaffenhofen. Turn left at the traffic lights towards Herrsching/Oberpfaffenhofen/Wessling. After about 800 meters you will see the entrance to DLR on your left.

Accessing DLR

You must enter DLR through the main entrance. All registered participants will be announced at the entrance.

If you are arriving by car, please turn right just before the entrance gate where you can park your car.

Please enter the entrance building to the right of the gate (building 111/01, marked in blue on the map) and have your ID card or passport ready.

You will be issued with a badge valid for the duration of the CEOS conference. This badge will allow you to enter and leave the DLR campus at any time. On the last day, please insert your badge in the "guest" slot at the exit to return your badge.

The conference will take place in building 124, marked in green. You can get there by following the route indicated.

If you are travelling by car, you will be directed to P170 (dark cyan on the map).




Figure 2: DLR site map

Hotel Information

Coffee-Fellow Hotel Freiham

The hotel is located directly on the S-Bahn line S8 between Munich city center and DLR. Freiham is an up-and coming new district of Munich, which was (and still is) built within in the last 5 years. Get off at “Freiham” station and walk. The entrance to the hotel is on Clarita-Bernhard-Straße.

Hotel Amper Germering

The hotel is located in the city center of Germering, a city of about 40000 inhabitants between Munich and DLR. Restaurants and shops are nearby. It is a 5-10 minute walk from the S-Bahn station to the hotel.




Figure 4: Map of Hotel Amper, Germering (@OpenStreetMap)

Courtyard Oberpfaffenhofen Munich South

From the hotel it is just a 5 minutes walk to DLR.
Follow the main road (Münchner Straße) to the DLR main Entrance.




Figure 5: Map of Courtyard Oberpfaffenhofen (©OPenStreetMap)

Seehof Wessling

The Seehof Wessling is also within walking distance of the DLR and close to the S-Bahn line 8. To get to DLR, walk down “Hauptstraße” or “Münchner Straße” and follow the sidewalk on the right. Outside the town, the path will take you through some woods next to the road. You will have to cross a roundabout before reaching the main entrance of DLR after about 20 minutes.




Figure 6: Map of Seehof Wessling Hotel (©OpenStreetMap)

Further Information

Weather

October is fall in Munich. There can be cold days, but also beautiful sunny days. The leaves of the trees change color, creating a beautiful scene on the landscape. Temperatures range from 5 – 15 degrees Celsius (average around 10 degrees). Be prepared for occasional rain!

Time Zone

Munich's time zone is Central European Time (CET), which is UTC+2 in October.

Currency

Germany, like many European countries, uses the Euro. Cash payments are still common throughout the country. Not all shops accept cards, especially credit cards.

Safety Numbers

The emergency number in Germany is 110. You can call it from anywhere. The safety number on the DLR campus is 2222, which will coordinate help on campus

Phone Access Codes

The country code for Germany is 49 and the area code for (most of Munich) is 89.

Electrical Power Supply

The power supply in Germany is 230V at 50Hz. The primary socket types are Schuko and Europlug (see illustration below). Delegates are strongly encouraged to bring their own power adapters for use with laptops and other electrical devices.




Figure 8: Schuko plug
